ABOUT

Bunker Hill Community College is one of the largest colleges in the state's community college system. It offers 17 Associate in Arts degrees, 40 Associate in Science degrees, 39 certificate programs and incorporates multicultural and international perspectives in its courses, programs and institutional climate. BHCC is well renowned for its academic excellence and international students play a central role in the college community.

Agreements between BHCC and many four-year colleges and universities allow BHCC graduates to transfer, often with junior-year status, to top institutions throughout the United States. BHCC has a significant international student population and offers an International Center that serves as a student's "home away from home".

LOCATION

A vibrant and culturally rich city with the largest concentration of college and universities in the United States, Boston is a very popular destination for international students. Bunker Hill Community College's main campus is located in the historic Charlestown neighborhood of Boston, a short distance from such cultural landmarks as Faneuil Hall, Quincy Market, and the renowned Freedom Trail.
